- Product can be shot for companies and services
- Still Life can be shot for editorial, story telling and enhancement of a story or concept



LIGHTING CONSIDERATIONS

- · Use light in as close as you can for the effect that you want
- Understand how the subject can influence the light
- Subject Centric Lighting will focus you on the product and how it reacts/ responds to the light
- Everything reflects. Everything.
- · How light reflects is more important than how it is applied
- Learning to Control the light is the most important part of Table Top Product and Still Life Photography



COLOR'S EFFECT ON LIGHT



 Notice how the light shows differently on similar objects with same surface efficiency

ANGLE OF INCIDENT


- The top knife is turned away from the angle of incidence that would result in a specular reflection of the softbox
- The lower knife has been angled to show the reflection of the softbox as a specular





LEARNING TO SEE THE TRANSITIONS

- Notice the different ways that the specular transitions on this image.
- Very sharp transition from specular to true value
- More gentle transition from specular to true value
- The difference is the efficiency of the surface.




TRUE VALUES / TRANSITIONS

- The transition from true value to shadow is very soft.
- This indicates a large light source.
- Subtle transitions show texture and color
- A more porous surface means a softer transition from specular to true value and true value to shadow



SHARPTRANSITIONS FROM TRUE VALUE TO SHADOW

- A small light source will create a 'harder' shadow transition
- Hard shadows can reveal texture and shape.
- Using the shadow as a compositional element is also a possibility
